BER- Funded School Projects to Benefit from NSW Government Planning Law Changes





On 10 March 2009 the NSW Government passed new law that aims to enable all BER (Building the Education Revolution) - funded projects to be fast-tracked through the approvals (DA) process. It is contained in the Nation Building and Jobs Plan (State Infrastructure Delivery) Act 2009.

Why the need to have a project manager helping with your BER-funded school project?

- We develop strategies for fast-tracking your project.
- We look after your interests, not the designer or builder or others.
- Better project coordination & control: on time & budget.
- Controlling cost & design variations, supervision of architects, engineers.

It gives the NSW Coordinator General Infrastructure wide powers to take over local council planning approvals, if warranted, and strong coordination powers over other agencies involved in approving BER-funded school projects eg. Rural Fire Service, RTA etc.

Coupled with the 20 February 2009 changes to State Environmental Planning Policy (Infrastructure) 2007 (SEPP), which allows non-government schools to build significant school projects without the necessity for local council approval, there are new opportunities for schools to move quickly forward and build new school infrastructure, including classrooms, multipurpose halls, libraries etc.

A 12 metre height limit now applies- previously 6.5 metres.

Questions & Answers

I. Our (non-government) school is established, but the local zoning does not permits schools. What do we do?

Get help!! Prepare your Development Application (DA) & once you have BER funding, apply to the NSW Coordinator General Infrastructure for intervention STRAIGHT AWAY. Call us & we can help you with this process.

NOTE 1: You will not get any help from the NSW Coordinator General Infrastructure for any NON-BER component of your school project.

NOTE 2: You will still need to prepare all necessary DA-type documentation in support of your new school project.

2. Our school is allowed under zoning controls. We want new (BER-funded) buildings. What do we do?

No council approval required. We can help you develop a strategy for moving forward with obtaining complying development certificates & other govt. approvals, if needed.

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The new planning laws will be of particular interest to proponents of school projects that, for the first time, are clearly identified as <u>not</u> requiring a local council development consent.
